


The ferries of the Alaska Marine Highway travel a route so special it has been designated a National Scenic Byway.

Southeast: The Inside Passage

Surrounded by the Tongass National Forest, Alaska's Inside Passage treats you to spectacular natural beauty, fjords filled with wildlife, lush islands, and a rich mixture of Native, early Russian, and Gold Rush history.

South Central: Prince William Sound & Kenai Peninsula

Home to over half of Alaska's population, four mountain ranges and numerous lakes, the central region is a wilderness playground. Enjoy world-class fishing, hiking and abundant wildlife viewing. Travelers can drive off the ferry and on to Anchorage, Denali & Fairbanks.

Southwest: Kodiak & the Aleutian Chain

From coastal grasslands to rumbling, snow-capped volcanoes, Southwest Alaska has a character all its own. Home to numerous national wildlife refuges, where brown bears amble and over 240 bird species inhabit the windswept Aleutian Islands that make a 1,000-mile sweep into the Pacific.
